Mrs Lambley to the Minister for Infrastructure, Planning and Logistics:

Arrernte Living Cultural Centre, Akeyulerre Incorporated, 3-5 Stuart Terrace, Alice Springs

You stated in your response to Written Questions 272 that the \$5m allocated to the Akeyulerre Incorporated Arrente Living Cultural Centre was not a part of the Alice Springs Revitalisation Project. Yet the original Government press release dated 24 July 2019 and current Alice Springs Revitalisation website state it is.

- Please explain this. Why was it announced and promoted originally as a part of the Alice Springs Revitalisation Project and now you say it is not a part of it?
- 2. If this \$5m was never allocated under the Alice Springs Revitalisation Project, why was it promoted and publicised as such?
- 3. Was \$5m ever taken out of the total of \$20m of the Alice Springs Revitalisation Project for the funding of the Arrente Living Cultural Centre?
- 4. Was there a change in the funding arrangement at any time for this project? If so please explain and provide details.
- 5. How did Akeyulerre Incorporated apply for funding for the Arrente Living Cultural Centre? Did they apply for a particular grants offered by the Government?
- 6. How was the concept of an Arrernte Living Cultural Centre by Akeyulerre Incorporated first presented to the NT Government?
 - a. Please provide details as to who, when and where did this information and proposal pass onto the NT Government.
 - b. Please provide information as to what Minister (s) were involved in the initial receipt of information, the initial contact or meeting with Akeyulerre Incorporated about this idea.

- 7. Were other submission from other organisations assessed at the same time as this submission from Akeyulerre Incorporated?
- 8. What was the name of the funding package that the Akeyulerre Incorporated applied for when they were successful in winning \$5m for their project, Arrente Living Cultural Centre? Please provide details.
- 9. Was this a part of a capital funding package offered to organisations or businesses? If so, provide all details of when the package was announced (specific dates), how applications were assessed and approved and provide a list of all other organisations that were funded in this round of funding.
- 10. Was the capital funding for Arrente Living Cultural Centre provided under an "unsolicited proposal"? If so, provide details.
- 11. Who in Government (the department, Minister or senior official) facilitated this funding?
- 12. What Minister (s) were involved in this funding deal?
- 13. The former manager of Akeyulerre Incorporated, Penny Drysdale, was employed by the former Minister for Territory Families, Dale Wakefield for a period. Did Ms Drysdale or Ms Wakefield have anything to do with the funding of \$5m to Akeyulerre Incorporated for the Arrernte Living Cultural Centre? If so, provide all details.

ANSWER:

The Territory Labor Government has outlined significant and historic redevelopment projects to recognise Alice Springs as Australia's Inland Capital - creating jobs, boosting visitation and supporting local businesses.

The Media release of 24 July 2019, "New \$5 million Grant for Arrernte Living Cultural Centre" does not refer to the Alice Springs Revitalisation Project, however the Revitalising Alice website (https://revitalisingalice.nt.gov.au/) provides an overview of these projects and investments, including the Kilgariff Land Release, Sporting Infrastructure and the National Aboriginal Art Gallery. It is not limited to a single commitment.

Information regarding the Arrente Living Cultural Centre and its funding has been previously provided in Written Question 272.
