As a long-term resident and practicing Landscape Architect in the Northern Territory for over 30 years, I feel compelled to voice my opposition to the government's revised proposal for a Territory Coordinator endowed with extraordinary powers. This initiative raises significant concerns regarding the erosion of local governance and community input in decision-making processes.

The proposed role of the Territory Coordinator, which effectively places immense authority in the hands of a single individual closely aligned with the Chief Minister, threatens to undermine the democratic principles that should govern our territory.
