**14. CENSURE OF CHIEF MINISTER — MOTION:**

Ms Lawrie (Leader of the Opposition) moved — That this house censures the now Chief Minister:

for his cowardly knifing of the former Chief Minister Terry Mills while he was overseas representing the Territory;

becoming an illegitimate Chief Minister by ignoring that Territorians voted for Terry Mills as Chief Minister only seven months ago;

the damage to the reputation of the Northern Territory caused by his actions;

the damage he has done to the business community in the Northern Territory;  
and

the lies that have led to lost jobs opportunities for Territorians.

Debate ensued.

Mr Elferink (Leader of Government Business) moved an amendment in the following terms — Omit all words after ‘as would’ and insert in their stead:

prevent this House from censuring the now Leader of the Opposition for her calamitous mismanagement of the Northern Territory budget whilst she was Treasurer.

Debate ensued.

Debate suspended.

Ms Lawrie (Leader of the Opposition) addressed the Assembly.
