- 1. Have any estimates been made of the full year revenue effect of royalties on possible interstate gas sales to South Australian buyers.
- 2. What was the Mine Injury Frequency Rate for the following financial years -
- (a) 1990-91; and
- (b) 1991-92.
- 3. How did the Mine Injury Frequency Rate for 1991-92 compare to that in other states.
- 4. What expenditure was undertaken in 1991-92 in support of a project being developed by AireSearch Pty Ltd.
- 5. Was any staff travel undertaken in relation to a project being developed by AireSearch Pty Ltd; if so, what are the details of both national and international travel.
- 6. How many field hours were spent on geological surveying in 1991-92.
- 7. Is there a significant difference between the 12 725 hours spent on geological surveying in 1990-91 and those spent in 1991-92; if so, what is the explanation.

ANSWER

- 1. Yes. It is estimated that \$5.2m (1992 dollars) would be paid to the NT government.
- 2. 1990-91 22.7; and 1991-92 22.2.

3. WA 21; Qld 22; Tas 54; and NSW 16.

- 4. The department expended \$1405.79 on operation costs.
- 5. The Director of Special Projects and Promotions Division attended the signing of the contractual agreement between a consortium from the Peoples Republic of China and AireSearch Pty Ltd.

This was at the specific request of the Peoples Republic. The total cost of this trip was \$4500 for air fare and travel allowance.

This was the only national or international travel undertaken in relation to this project.
