Commercial Fishing Operations in Aboriginal waters

- 1. How many compliance patrols were been completed in the 22/23 and 23/24 financial years in relation to Aboriginal waters that have been closed by Traditional Owners? If none, when was the last date a compliance patrol was completed? Could you provide a breakdown of patrols completed by the compliance team in the 22/23 and 23/24 financial year, including if they resulted in any prosecutions?
- 2. What are the fisheries management concerns that have been raised by Traditional Owners in relation to Aboriginal Waters that have been closed in the last 3 years?
 - a. What have you done to address these concerns?
 - b. How have you relayed this information back to Traditional Owners?
- 3. In 2022, the compliance team took over some functions of the Water Police.
 - a. How many full time equivalent staff does the compliance team have?
 - b. How is the team managing such a vast area of coastline and waterways?
 - c. How is the compliance teams prioritising areas?
 - d. How is the compliance team addressing reports of fishers operating illegally in Aboriginal Waters?
 - e. What is the Government doing to work with the compliance team and NT Police to support Traditional Owners with sea country management?
 - f. What measures are in place to ensure independence of the compliance unit when they sit within the licencing, and therefore revenue generating, agency?
- 4. How can Vessel Monitoring System (VMS) data be accessed by ranger groups and land councils to monitor vessels travelling in and out of Aboriginal Waters?
