Police Northern Command includes 196 general duties, investigative and police auxiliary liquor inspectors roles across Katherine, Nhulunbuy and other regional and remote stations including Wadeye, Maningrida, Groote Eylandt and Borroloola amongst others. Supported by 31 public sector roles, including Aboriginal Liaison Officers

Some previous Northern Command Police Stations are now managed by Greater Darwin Command and have been removed from this response. This includes Wurrumiyanga, Pirlangimpi, Milikapiti, Adelaide River and Batchelor Police Stations.

Police Southern Command includes 363 general duties, investigative and police auxiliary liquor inspectors roles across Alice Springs, Tennant Creek and other regional and remote stations including Yuendumu, Yulara and Kintore amongst others. The Northern Territory Police Force (NTPF) is a frontline service delivery agency. While the NTPF does not directly administer cost-of-living subsidies, concessions or household financial assistance programs, the agency contributes to cost-of-living outcomes through its core role in reducing crime, improving community safety and supporting safer communities across the Territory.

This aligns with Priority 4 of the Government's Restoring the Territory Lifestyle Strategy, by supporting safer communities, reducing crime and improving public confidence. It also supports Priority 1 of the Rebuilding the Economy Strategy,

recognising that community safety is a key enabler of economic confidence, business activity, workforce participation and investment.

During the reporting period, NTPF's relevant contribution has been through the delivery of policing services across the Territory, including frontline policing, crime prevention, road safety, emergency response, community engagement and support to regional and remote communities.

NTPF has not implemented specific programs during the reporting period that are designed primarily to provide direct household or business cost-of-living relief.
