Question: Can the Minister please advise what the repairs and maintenance money has been spent on in police since the Renewal Management Board's recommendations. If you can, advise what the Renewal Management Board's recommendations were, and what are the things still to be done. Essentially how you have prioritised what you have done and what is remaining to be done.

Answer:

At the time of the Renewal Management Board, the Building Asset Management System managed by the Department of Infrastructure recorded a maintenance need of \$19.863M per year for the forward estimates period for the Northern Territory Police, Fire and Emergency Services. The base funding allocation was \$7.888M for the forward estimates period.

Additional Repairs and Maintenance funding has been provided as follows:

- 2012-13 + \$1.6M;
- 2013-14 + \$3.464M; and
- 2014-15 + \$2.237M.

Identified Repairs and Maintenance need is prioritised with the highest priority being occupational health and safety, building envelope (weatherproofing), operational function and building form.
