# Youth Justice Strategy, Alice Springs

With reference to the existence of a Youth Justice 'strategy' mentioned by you and your colleagues during the recent parliamentary sittings:

- (1) Will you provide the Member for Araluen with a copy of the strategy.
- (2) Will you advise what and which agencies and individuals you met with to assist in the development of the strategy so far as it relates to Alice Springs.

# ANSWER

#### Northern Territory Government Youth Justice Strategy

The Northern Territory Government has committed \$2.5M to a broad strategy to combat youth crime and antisocial behaviour.

The Strategy has three main elements:

- limiting access to the youth diversion program, so that repeat young offenders will face court, not diversion;
- the introduction of Family Responsibility Agreements and Orders, and programs to support families and young people. The Agreements and Orders will commence on 1 July 2008 and be administered by the Department of Health and Families; and
- the introduction of youth camps in Alice Springs and the Top End.

### **Limiting Access to Youth Diversion**

Amendments to the *Youth Justice Act* have been made to prevent young offenders being referred to diversion programs more than twice.

Young people who repeatedly break the law will face court, and tough penalties, including detention.

#### Family Responsibility Agreements and Orders

New Family Responsibility Agreements will hold parents accountable for their child's antisocial behaviour or criminal activity.

Parents who are unwilling to enter an Agreement, or breach their Agreement may face a court imposed Family Responsibility Order.

Police can also seek a Family Responsibility Order immediately where a young person has been charged with an offence or breached a bail condition.

If the conditions of the order are not met, parents will face fines of up to \$2200, the seizure of non-essential household items or a Community Work Order.

Centres will be established in Darwin and Alice Springs to case manage the young people and families who are subject to Agreements and Orders, and to maintain a network of youth and family support services to which families and young people can be referred.

### Youth Camps

Under the Youth Justice Strategy, Government will establish youth camps in the Top End and Central Australia.

The camps will work with those kids who are at risk of criminal behaviour, getting them back on the right path.

The camps will work with other youth organisations, including the new centres, to give guidance and support to young people, assist them develop life and work skills and get them back to school or into training.

Under the Strategy, three youth camps have been established and are operating in both the Top End and Central Australia. During 2008-09, Government will work to expand these options.

A consultant, Mr Tony Kelly, was engaged to develop options for a youth camp in Alice Springs.
