- Framing the Future was announced in the Legislative Assembly on 20 August 2013.
- A draft of the Government's Framing the Future strategy plan was released for community consultation in October 2013. 75 comments were received, mostly from individuals, along with 12 submissions from organisations.
- Advertising across the Northern Territory promoted the opportunity to provide feedback on the draft strategy.
- The marketing cost includes both design (Bellette Media) and printing (Government Printing Office).
- The marketing, advertising and promotion of this project were supported from within existing staff resources.

- The Northern Australia Development Office will showcase and market Northern Australia
 to prospective investors and facilitate a 'one stop shop' arrangement for stakeholders
 interested in the development of Northern Australia. The Office will also be a conduit
 between the NT Government, the Australian Governments and industry groups.
- A SAO1 level marketing project officer was contracted in early March 2014 to support the campaign and is based within the Communications and Marketing Bureau.

- The Developing the North campaign was still under development during the reporting period. The bulk of media and advertising activity falls outside the reporting period.
- The multimedia work was to support the development of a suite of presentation tools to help promote the Northern Territory as part of developing Northern Australia, and also for use with international businesses and investors. This work was completed by the Presentation Studio.

3. The 6th Indigenous Economic Development (IED) Forum was predominately funded through sponsorship and registration fees providing a cost effective way of presenting business sessions and workshops to assist with business up-skilling and showcasing Indigenous businesses, business opportunities, programs and initiatives, particularly to Indigenous people from regional and remote regions.

The cost to the NT Government to deliver the 6th IED Forum was as follows:

4. The NT Government is proactive in development of regional and remote economies, drawing on internal expertise and sourcing expert advice where and when required.

A significant aspect of the development of regional and remote towns is the associated industry in and surrounding those towns. The NT Government, through relevant industry agencies, has industry plans and strategies which target regional economic development.

The Department of the Chief Minister works with other agencies and stakeholders to maximise economic development in the regions and remote towns including feeding into specific consultancies such as the Katherine Freight Hub which is being led by the Department of Business, and broader work such as the Regional Infrastructure Study being led by the Department of Transport.

 There are four Regional Economic Development Committees (REDC) – one each in Alice Springs, Tennant Creek, Katherine and Nhulunbuy. The four REDCs comprise a total of fifty members.

Members participate on a voluntary basis and are not provided any payments/sitting fees or payment for travel expenses.

The Committees meet monthly and are supported by NT Government staff based in the regions. Where possible, meetings take place at government venues free of charge.

The government covers the costs of venue hire and refreshments when required. As at March 2014, the REDCs had met 43 times. Catering costs for these 43 meetings total \$2928.09. Venue hire costs for these 43 meetings were \$95.00.

 The Regional Economic Development Fund (REDF) was established in 2000 and has been administered by a series of NT Government departments in line with the Administrative Arrangement Orders.

The Department of the Chief Minister has administered the REDF grant program since September 2013.

Attachment A outline details of the grants from the 2010-11 financial year to 31 March 2014. Due to the administrative burden in sourcing the requested information from different departments ranging back fourteen years, the REDF records prior to 2010-11 have not been collated.

Because of project timeframes, approval dates and final expenditure may fall in different financial years.

The total grant budget for 2013-14 is \$426 000, with \$154 000 in grants awarded to 31 March 2014. It is expected the fund will be fully allocated by the end of the financial year.

The Department of the Chief Minister is leading the economic development program on the Tiwi Islands and working across government to align efforts for the benefit of all Tiwi.

Through this work, the Department has worked with other agencies to undertake the following activities. Note that these expenses have not all been expended at this point:

9. The NT Government is committed to economic development on the Tiwi Islands and the creation of jobs for Tiwi People.

The Tiwi People have a proud history of commerce and today own and operate a number of successful enterprises. The Tiwi People recognise that investment and development will create additional opportunities on the Islands for Tiwi people.

In August 2013, the Land Development Corporation paid \$1 million (excluding GST) upfront and in good faith to facilitate leasing 10 040ha of land on the Tiwi Islands. This payment was made to Tiwi Resources, the entity nominated by the Tiwi Land Council.

This payment demonstrates commitment to working with the Tiwi People to develop their lands for their economic future and is conditional upon consent as per the provisions of the *Aboriginal Land Rights (Northern Territory) Act 1976* (Cth).

The purpose of this project is to progress commercial development on the Tiwi Islands in a manner that is supported by Traditional Owners for job creation and economic development benefiting Tiwi Island residents.

The Land Development Corporation is working with the Tiwi Land Council to consult with Traditional Owners and affected Aboriginals on the Islands to identify lands which may be suitable for leasing.

Should appropriate lands be identified, the Land Development Corporation will lease those lands on the Tiwis for 99 years subject to Traditional Owner and ministerial consent in compliance with the *Aboriginal Land Rights (Northern Territory) Act 1976* (Cth).

The Land Development Corporation anticipates that it will sublease this land to businesses on a commercial basis.

Once suitable land for leasing is identified, the Land Development Corporation will engage independent valuers to ensure that the total value of land to be leased is equivalent to \$1 million.
