Transit Safety Officers

1. How many Transit Safety Officers are currently employed in the Department of Infrastructure, Planning and Logistics (DIPL)?

There are 18 positions within the Transit Safety Unit.

2. What level are each of these positions?

1x SAO1 Manager Transit Safety
1x AO7 Assistant Manager
2x AO6R Senior Transit Officers
14x AO5R Transit Officers

3. Are there currently any vacant positions pending recruitment?

Yes.

4. What is the average turnover of these positions?

The average staff turnover since 2017 has been 1.6 per year in the Transit Safety Unit.

5. Has the Transit Safety Unit contracted out any work due to staff shortages?

No, however, the Department contracts static security guards who are stationed at bus interchanges.

6. If so, to what extent?

Not applicable.

7. How much is the 2021/22 salaries budget for the Transit Safety Unit?

The total personnel budget for the Transit Safety Unit is \$2 567 000.

8. What was the actual salaries expenditure for the Transit Safety Unit in 2019/20 and 2020/21?

2019-20 - \$2 610 419 2020-21 - \$2 623 361 9. What was the total budget for the Transit Safety Unit in 2019/20 and 2020/21?

2019-20 - \$1 536 000 2020-21 - \$2 816 000

10. What was the total expenditure for the Transit Safety Unit for 2019/20?

2019-20 - \$2 961 542

11. Are there any plans to increase the number of Transit Safety Officers given recent increase in anti-social behaviour on public buses across the network?

The Department will continue to prioritise expenditure to enable maximum capacity in this important function.

12. How will Transit Safety Officers be enabled to improve the safety of bus drivers and passengers over the next 2 years?
