I am writing to you today as a concerned constituent and a Christian to express my strong opposition to the proposed assisted suicide bill. I believe this legislation is fundamentally flawed and represents a dangerous step for our society.

My opposition stems from deeply held moral and ethical convictions rooted in my Christian faith. As Christians, we believe that all life is a sacred gift from God, from conception to natural death. The Bible teaches us that every person is created in God's image, and as such, every life has inherent value and dignity, regardless of age, health, or disability.

The bill, in my view, undermines this fundamental principle by allowing for the intentional ending of a human life. While I understand the compassionate intent behind such a bill—to alleviate suffering—I believe that the solution to suffering is not to end a person's life, but to offer them comfort, care, and support. This is where I believe our focus should be: on expanding and improving palliative care services so that every person can live their final days free from pain and with dignity, surrounded by love and compassion.

Furthermore, I am deeply concerned about the potential for coercion and abuse. The bill's provisions, no matter how carefully crafted, cannot fully protect the vulnerable. The elderly, the disabled, and those with mental health issues could be subtly or overtly pressured into choosing assisted suicide. The message this bill sends is that some lives are not worth living, and that a person can be a burden to their family or society. This is a cruel and dangerous message to send to the most vulnerable among us.

The value of a human life should not be determined by a person's physical or mental health. I urge you to consider the broader implications of this bill and to stand against its passage. Instead, let us advocate for a society that cherishes and protects life at all stages, and that provides comprehensive support and care for those who are suffering.

Thank you for your time and consideration of my views. I trust that you will give this important matter the careful and thoughtful attention it deserves.
