Answer

1. It is assumed that the '20 positions' referred to in the question relate to the difference in the staffing reported in the 2013/14 Budget Paper 3 of 654 and the 2014/15 BP3 staffing figure of 634.

The numbers used to report in Budget Paper 3 are not prospective or indicative of the expected numbers of staff in 2014/15. The figure reflects the actual numbers of staff in the agency as at March 2014 and are therefore historical.

The difference between the 2013/14 and 2014/15 budget papers is a result of reduction in staffing following on from the 2012 Mini Budget such as executive contract staff and the ceasing temporary corporate and executive staff. Frontline staff were not affected by the 2012 Mini Budget.

3. All Commonwealth funding received by the Department of Children and Families relates to Stronger Futures in the Northern Territory national partnership agreement (SFNT). The SFNT was signed in 2012 and expires on 30 June 2022. DCF has programs under the Health (schedule A) and Child, Youth, Family and Community Wellbeing (schedule E) implementation plans (IP). These are as follows:

Answer

a. Anglicare is funded \$466,000 to deliver intensive youth support services to highly vulnerable young people referred by DCF. The service will provide a therapeutic case management service tailored to meet the young person's needs. The service will have core hours, but be able to be contacted 24 hours a day.

The contract negotiations are in train.

b. The Youth Street Outreach Service commenced in August 2010 with funding for 5 staff.

YSOS increased its staffing and its hours of operation in January 2012 using resources deployed from the Central Australian Child Protection Office. While the total staffing complement at its peak was 9 staff (five professional staff and four administration staff), the actual number of staff operating afterhours was relatively stable at between 4 and 5 staff over last 3 years. Daytime staff varied at between 3 and 4 staff.

Averaged out as FTE, the officers employed to deliver afterhours youth support in Alice Springs was 4.82 in 2011/12; 4 in 2012/13; and 4.92 in 2013/14.

1. The stability of OoHC placements is an issue identified in the national Report on Government Services. The generally accepted indicator for stability is "the proportion of children exiting care that had one or two placements".

In the year-to-date, 86.5 per cent of children exiting care after less than 12 months in the Northern Territory had one or two placements; this proportion is consistent with the national rate from 2012-13.

The agency is working to further increase the stability of OoHC placements through its focussed reform of the OoHC system. Measures to improve stability include the establishment of a centralised placement unit and process, which requires a long-term strategy when placing children into care; and the efforts to increase the number of foster and kinship carers offering long-term care for children.

2. What proportion of out-of-home care placements involve siblings of the same family and in those circumstances what proportion of those siblings are able to be cared for together, rather than being separated?

Answer

2. The placement of children with their siblings is a priority for the department and all efforts are taken to ensure, that where possible, children are placed with their siblings and relatives. This principle has been strengthened in 2013-14 with the development and release of the Department's Standards of Professional Practice and the Charter of Rights for Children and Young People in Care in the Northern Territory.

Operationally, the new placement process and instrument introduced in November 2013 requires, in a dedicated section, that all OoHC placements consider a child's siblings and other relatives in OoHC.

An indicator relating to the placement of children with siblings has been flagged for the *National Out-of-Home Care Standards* and the *Report on Government Services* as a future reporting option, however the capture and reporting of this indicator requires further development in the system and reporting environment. The department is currently working to develop this reporting capacity.
