## **QUESTION ON NOTICE 5.10**

Will the Minister provide details of the number of screenings at BreastScreen NT Alice Springs from the date it opened?

## **ANSWER**

As shown below, the number of women screened in the national target group, aged 50-69 years, has progressively increased since the service opened in Alice Springs and has maintained a significant increase from 2002 onwards. This corresponds to the time when the service model changed to concentrated block periods for screening.

Screening for the target group is much higher in 2007 than in 1997 which was claimed as the better and more accessible service. The number of women screened in the target group has increased by 62% since 1997.

Whilst there may be variations in the total number of women screened over the past 10 years, the evidence supports the rationale for focussing efforts on the target group, as age is the biggest risk factor in developing the disease. Over 75 per cent of breast cancers occur in women 50 years and over<sup>1</sup>.
