### Question on Notice 8.3334 How many hectares are covered by a bushfire plan?

The exact area covered by all bushfire plans is not available however individual plans have been or are being developed for rural properties across the Savannas Region and in the Alice Springs Region.

## Question on Notice 8.14 What's the cost of development of a bushfire plan?

Costs of individual plans vary according to the degree of complexity, the number of visits to the landowner and the distance from centres in which staff are located. The development of a fire plan is an interactive process between one or more land managers and Bushfires NT staff. Currently two staff are actively involved in fire planning for the Savannas and Alice Springs Region (which combined cover more than half the Territory). These staff and operations cost approximately \$200,000 per year.
