Learning on the job

What programs are being provided in remote areas for learning on the job?

The Department of Trade, Business and Innovation (DTBI) programs that provide learning on the job are:

- User Choice Training Program - Apprenticeship and Traineeship job related training
- Industry Build Skills - existing workers training, directly related to employment of the individual
- General Recurrent Funding - General Skills Training through:
 - Charles Darwin University
 - Batchelor Institute of Indigenous Tertiary Education
 - Seafood Maritime Industry Training
 - Nungalinga College
 - Institute for Aboriginal Development, and
 - Centre for Appropriate Technology.
- Aboriginal Responsive Skilling Grants – A responsive grant program to meet the needs of Aboriginal people living in urban, regional and remote NT communities by providing access to skilling opportunities leading to employment outcomes, and
- Local Jobs Traineeship Program – A traineeship program targeted to employers in remote and regional communities who are employing Aboriginal trainees. Delivered in partnership with Group Training Northern Territory.

DTBI programs that **may** include learning on the job are:

- Aboriginal Workforce Grants – Applications are invited from businesses and organisations in competitive annual grant rounds.
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
