Health Services in Territory Growth Towns

QUESTION

In relation to the delivery of health services to Northern Territory Growth Towns:

For each of the identified growth towns of Maningrida, Wadeye, Borroloola, Galiwinku, Nguiu, Gunbalanya, Milingimbi, Ngukurr, Numbulwar, Angurugu/Umbakumba, Gapuwiyak, Yuendumu, Yirrkala, Lajamanu, Daguragu/Kalkarindji, Ramingining, Hermannsburg, Papunya, Elliott and Ali Curung -

1. What planning has been put in place to answer the needs of the proposed growth towns in each of the following areas;

(a) community and Civic Facilities;

These do not sit within the Health portfolio.

(b) health, aged care and disability facilities; and

Each of the Territory Growth Towns engage in an annual health service planning process and includes services to the surrounding communities and outstations/homelands.

The need for services is considered against demand and the agreed core primary health care services, defined and endorsed by the Northern Territory Aboriginal Health Forum.

The health plans are reviewed and approved by regional health boards or steering committees which are currently operating in most Territory Growth Towns. Borroloola, Papunya and Wadeye are in the process of developing their health steering committees.

Fifteen of the 20 Territory Growth Towns have also been identified as priorities in the Council of Australia Government (COAG) process of National Partnership Agreements to Close The Gap in Indigenous Disadvantage. These communities have been undergoing intensive community consultation which involves many aspects of the community, including health services.

Local Reference Groups are identifying opportunities for service and infrastructure improvement as part of the Remote Service Delivery Partnership. By July 2010, they will have agreed Local Implementation Plans approved by the Northern Territory Government, Australian Government and Shire. The Local Implementation Plans will be reviewed annually.

(c) recreation and sporting facilities.

These do not sit within the Health portfolio.

2. For each town;

(a) what health services are currently provided, in terms of personnel permanently based and facilities available;

(b) what visiting health services are available, and on what frequency; and

(c) what is the current expenditure on government provided health services.

This question requires a significant amount of effort by the agency to produce an answer that would provide the detail requested.

The Department of Health and Families is involved in preparing for Estimates Committee hearings and in doing so will be collating information similar to that which has been requested.

In order to avoid unnecessary pressure and duplication by the public servants who have to provide this information, the Minister will be prepared to answer these questions in further detail at Estimates Committee.
