**Question:** Administrative Costs to the Department of Education

To: MINISTER for EDUCATION

- 1. Will the rationalisation of administrative processes within the Department bring about the abolition of 50 positions; and if so -
- (a) what will those positions be; and
- (b) from where will they be abolished.
- 2. Has the department estimated the additional time in administration for teachers which will result from the closure of school stores.
- 3. Will the department provide administrative assistance to arrange orders for materials in those schools where no telephone communications exist.
- 4. Does the department anticipate that the provision of supplies through direct purchase by schools will be less expensive for schools; if so, how has this calculation been arrived at.
- 5. What security will be set into place on personnel files stored on computer.

## **ANSWER**

- 1. Yes.
- (a) and (b)

9 positions from Alice Springs Regional Office; 20 positions from Supply Section (Darwin); and over time a further 21 positions through the introduction of the new Human Resource Management System and by the introduction of Risk Management Techniques.

- 2. Nil effect.
- 3. Schools in this category will be serviced by regional councils which have been established.
- 4. Yes, in some situations. The new arrangements will give more flexibility in procurement and period contracts will still be in place.
- 5. System-wide on-line personnel records (such as INTERPERS) are accessible only on a 'need to know' basis.
