

- 1. How many tenders to purchase the old Port Authority building at 18 Harry Chan Avenue were received.
- 2. What was the value of the selected tender.
- 3. Was this the highest value tendered.
- 4. If the answer to question 3 is no; what was the highest value tendered.
- Was all information regarding the tender provided equally to all tenderers.
- 6. Was all information provided equally to all tenderers either by oral or written advice.

ANSWER

- 1. Thirteen (13) tenders were received for the Darwin Port Authority building.
- 2. The successful tender offered a purchase price of \$550 000 with additional development on the site for \$3.5m over 30 months.
- 3. This was not the highest tender but was the highest conforming tender.
- 4. The highest tender was \$1.5m subject to guaranteed government leaseback of 10 000 m² of office space for 20 years. As the tender specification offered the property on a 2-year leaseback basis with a 3-year option only, this bid did not conform.
- 5. Information regarding the tender was provided equally to all tenderers.
