Youth Diversion and Programs

Please provide the following data for the 12 months to 30 September 2022:

1. Please list the Youth Justice Community Support and Diversion Programs available to youths, and the expenditure on each of these programs.

ANSWER

The Department provides recurrent funding to 13 organisations across 60 communities in the Northern Territory to support young people to participate in Community Youth Diversion (CYD) programs.

- There are two components to CYD programs services that are funded:
 - o Case management and referral coordination that ensures young people receive the services and support they need to reduce reoffending. This may include referral to other services and ensuring young people engage in services.
 - o Program delivery- delivery of programs directly to young people that are restorative, promote positive life pathways and assist to develop strategies to prevent reoffending.
- These services are also available to vulnerable young people aged eight years and above who are at risk of future contact with the formal youth justice system where capacity exists.

Youth detention centre programs include education and vocational training (delivered via the Department of Education), mentoring, recreation, self-care, life skills, therapeutic engagement, arts and music, culture, cooking, social and emotional wellbeing et cetera. For the period of 1 October 2021 to 30 September 2022, \$1,427,029.39 was expended for all programs across both Northern Territory detention centres.

Clinical programs and therapy are costed separately.
