- 4. If so, what security has been introduced?
- 5. How much has this security cost to date?
- 6. Have there been any incidents at the facility that have required police to be called?
- 7. If so, how many times have police attended?
- 8. How many police are now stationed on site?
- 9. Where have these police been drawn from?
- 10. How many evacuees have been presented to hospital?
- 11. What were the reasons they were presented?
- 12. Is alcohol allowed in the facility?
- 13. How are alcohol policies being enforced on site?
- 14. What are the measures in place to deal with intoxicated people entering the facility?
- 15. What, if any, measures have been taken to deal with domestic violence cases within the facility?
- 16. Is there now a Domestic Violence safe house operating in the facility?

- 17. Has there been any damage to infrastructure in the Centre for National Resilience during the hosting of the flood evacuees?
- 18. If so, what has been damaged?
- 19. How much will it cost to repair the damage?
- 20. Has any of the facility been deemed unusable and/or condemned?
- 21. What measures have been taken to ensure surrounding residents are not exposed to crime and/or anti-social behavior?
