Private security officers are contracted as required at each hospital to meet operational requirements.

- Alice Springs Hospital (ASH): contracted security officers as needed for 24/7 coverage.
- Gove District Hospital (GDH): contracted security officers provide 3 mobile patrols per day.
- Katherine Hospital (KH): 1 contracted security officer per shift per day for 24/7 coverage.
- Palmerston Regional Hospital (PRH): 3 contracted security officers per shift per day for 24/7 coverage.
- Royal Darwin Hospital (RDH): contracted security officers vary depending on current needs of the hospital for 24/7 coverage.
- Tennant Creek Hospital (TCH): 1 contracted security officer for night patrols and 24 hour coverage on weekends and public holidays.
