Dear Committee Members,

I am writing to express my opposition to the Territory Coordinator Bill currently before Parliament. This Bill poses a significant threat to democracy, environmental protection, and community rights in the Northern Territory.

The proposed legislation grants excessive power to the Chief Minister and an **unelected** Territory Coordinator, allowing them to override existing NT laws. **This undermines transparent governance and removes critical checks and balances that protect Territorians and their environment.**

My key concerns include:

**Threat to Democratic Process** – The Bill centralizes decision-making power in the hands of the Chief Minister and an unelected official, bypassing public consultation and established regulatory processes. This is an overreach that weakens democratic accountability.

**Environmental and Health Risks** – By reducing oversight of large industrial projects, the Bill endangers our water resources, land, and public health. The NT is already vulnerable to environmental pressures, and this legislation could exacerbate long-term damage.

**Economic and Social Harm** – The Bill prioritizes economic growth at any cost, often benefiting external corporations over local communities. The structure of these industries heavily relies on FIFO workers, limiting long-term economic benefits for Territorians.

I urge the Scrutiny Committee to recommend that this Bill be rejected to uphold democratic integrity, environmental protections, and community interests.
