Cyclical maintenance and unforeseen maintenance will not be impacted by Budget Reprioritisation. Previously identified Specific Maintenance projects will be prioritised to remain within cost saving strategies and budget reprioritisation.

To realise this saving, the Speaker may have to write to all Members advising that multifunction devices are not an entitlement and she is consulting on which Member might like to give theirs up.
