This answer is in relation to the tenders and contract portion of the question.

In providing these responses, the following qualifications have been made in the context of the question asked.

Tender – A Request of Tender (RFT) is a formal, structured invitation to suppliers for the supply of products or services. Under the NTG Procurement Directions, only procurement with an estimated value of \$200,000 and above (\geq Tier 4) requires the calling of a tender. Procurement under \$200,000 (Tier 3 and below) only require a **Quote** and hence have been excluded in this exercise as it was not asked for in the question. Likewise contracts arising from Quotes have also been excluded.

Contract – Once a supplier has submitted an RFT, the agency assesses the submission against the various selection criteria and awards the tenderer who best meets these with a legally binding Contract.

During the period 1 July 2013 to 31 March 2014, there were two tenders called for and two contracts awarded.

Mining Security Levy

Decision No BC13/26 approved the introduction of a levy on mining securities.

Amendments to the *Mining Management Act* (MMA) were passed in this Assembly last year. The MMA now provides for the introduction of an annual levy on mining securities to generate revenue to begin addressing the NT's legacy mining liabilities.

The new levy and other amendments came into effect on 1 October 2013.

Under the new arrangements, a 1% levy is applied to all operators issued an Authorisation under the MMA. The calculation is based on the level of financial security held for each operator's site as at 1 July each year, except for the first year when it was being applied from 1 October 2013. The amount of the levy will not change during the year, even if the security increases or decreases in that year. This is to minimise the administrative impact on both industry and government.

In return for payment of the levy, operators receive a 10% reduction in the level of security lodged with the Department of Mines and Energy. This amount is included within the contingency amount of the security applied to each site as part of the security calculation. The NT Government will continue to hold a minimum 100% of the remediation security for each site as at the point the security was submitted.

The approach being adopted is intended to be as cost neutral as possible. Operators with cash securities are financially better off. The situation for operators with bank guarantees as security is not as clear because the underlying financial arrangements are commercial-in-confidence. However, these operators will receive a benefit by a reduction in the overall servicing fees and the assets that are tied to guarantees.

At the point the levy was introduced, it was estimated the levy would generate \$6.45 million in revenue in the first full year of operation. A Mining Remediation Fund has been established with the objective of identifying and assessing the environmental risks of legacy sites and undertaking works to address urgent issues. It was estimated the fund would receive \$2 million in the first year. A small Legacy Mines Unit has been established to conduct this work.

Other funding goes towards officers employed within mining assessment teams, technical support areas and the Environmental Monitoring Unit, which all work daily on legacy mining and related issues. In addition, there is ongoing work with existing operators to ensure good environmental performance at the mitigation of potential legacy impacts.

It is acknowledged that the level of money collected is a relatively small amount when compared to the total liability facing the NT. However, well-planned works can have a significant beneficial impact on legacy sites. It is also the Government's intention to work closely with operators of sites where funds can be best applied to obtain maximum value.
