**Question:** How many shifts were Territory Response Group (TRG) officers and Water Police (WP) officers required to work in the Joint Emergency Services Communications Centre (JESCC) in 2015-16?

**Answer:**

As at 31 March 2016, no TRG or WP officers were required to work any shifts in the JESCC.

From October 2015 to the end of January 2016, assistance was sought from the Metropolitan Patrol Group (MPG) for provision of shifts for the JESCC. Nine MPG officers performed rostered shifts until the recruitment and training of 23 new AO3 call centre staff was completed for a total number of 530 shifts.

Since 27 January 2016, there has been no requirement to roster operational frontline police officers in the JESCC.
