## Answer:

The deployment of police resources at any particular time, location or task is an operational police matter, which will fluctuate dependent upon resource availability, major events and other operations. The below table provides the monthly average number of general duties van on the road for the three daily shifts broken down into divisions, as specified in the question.

## Note.

It should be noted that evening shift times vary considerably and can often operate until the early hours of the morning.
