Answer:	In the last 12 months, one additional Child Protection Worker position has		
	been funded by NT Families and Children to work within a new Targeted Family Support Service operating under the auspice of Central Australian		
	Aboriginal Congress in Alice Springs. This is a new partnership initiative		
	focussed on Indigenous families where there are multiple needs but no		
	immediate risk of serious harm to the children.		
	In order to support child protection workers and increase capacity within communities to respond to child protection issues, 11 full time positions and 1 part time position have been created under the Remote Aboriginal Family and Community Workers (RAFCW) Program in 7 Central Australian communities (Ti Tree, Hermannsburg, Yuendumu, Papunya, Santa Theresa, Docker River and Kalkarinji). These 12 positions include 2 full time team leaders located in Alice Springs and 1 part time team leader located in Tennant Creek.
