Question: How many notices for antisocial behaviour were served on public housing tenants for Darwin, Alice Springs, Tennant Creek,

Katherine and Nhulunbuy?

Answer:

There are several ways in which antisocial behaviour (ASB) is dealt with – some of these actions are initiated to terminate the tenancy and evict the tenant and others are put in place in an attempt to have the tenant modify their behaviour and thereby sustain their tenancy.

One action that can be initiated when the ASB is serious and ongoing is to issue a Notice to Remedy (NTR) under section 96B of the Residential Tenancies Act. This provides the tenant with a short period of time to

modify their behaviour. Failure to do so results in an application to the Commissioner of Tenancies for termination of the tenancy.

If the ASB isn't serious enough to warrant eviction the tenant can be requested to enter into an Acceptable Behaviour Agreement (ABA) under section 18A of the Housing Act. If a tenant refuses to sign an ABA or repeatedly and/or seriously breaches the terms of the ABA this may result in an application to the Local Court for termination of the tenancy.

ABAs

In 2009–10 75 tenants entered into an ABA. A break down for each location is as follows:

There were 29 NTR issued for antisocial behaviour across the Northern Territory in 2009-10 as follows:

Talking Points:

Antisocial Behaviour Generally

- A total of 1,555 antisocial behaviour complaints were recorded in the 2008-09 financial year.
- For 2009-10 to date, Territory Housing received 627 antisocial behaviour complaints. This compares to 1,351 for the same period last year.
- Territory Housing does not tolerate unacceptable behaviour and will move to eviction where it is clear that current initiatives will not work. 32% of evictions for 2009-10 to date have been antisocial behaviour related.
