## Harm Reduction interim report response

- 1. Do you intend to expand needle and syringe programs in the Northern Territory? If so, at what cost? (issue identified in interim report of Select Committee on a Northern Territory Harm Reduction Strategy for Addictive Behaviours)
- 2. What are you doing to introduce better coordination between treatment agencies? (issue identified in interim report of Select Committee on a Northern Territory Harm Reduction Strategy for Addictive Behaviours)
- 3. Is this the type of information sharing which may, in some part, be addressed through the new Core Clinical Systems Renewal Program?

## RESPONSE

- 1. Expansion of pharmacy outlet needle and syringe exchange sites continues as/when potential sites are identified, at no cost to the NT Government.
  - A pilot peer-led mobile outreach program to target people who inject drugs not utilising fixed site networks, is continuing to be explored with NT Aids and Hepatitis Council.
- 2. An Alcohol and Other Drugs (AOD) Coordination Group, comprising government and non-government representatives from across the sector, has been established to oversee the development of an AOD Treatment Services Plan. This group will address communication, workforce and service models.
- 3. The capture of this type of information is not within scope of the Core Clinical Systems Renewal Program.
