1. In the last few months have the locks been changed on all the Transport and Works buildings and depots in Tennant Creek.

2. If so, who had the contract to do the job and what was the cost.

3. Was the contract put out to tender, and if so, when.

4. If the contract did not go out to tender, then why not.

ANSWER

No, the locks on all the Department of Transport and Works buildings and depots have not been changed in the last few months.

The last time work of this nature was undertaken was in early June 1990, when the department had the local building maintenance period contractor, Tennant Creek Maintenance (Barry Renfrey), upgrade the security and locks on the department's facilities in Tennant Creek. W. Willeme of Darwin was the subcontract supplier of locks and security devices to Tennant Creek Maintenance.

The total value of the work undertaken was \$8000.

This work was not put out as an individual public tender as the work is minor lock replacements which fits within the scope of works tendered for in the Building Maintenance Period Contract.
