- 4. The estimated cost of the partially full dam in 1991 (April) dollars was \$21.7m. Allowing for subsequent escalation, the estimate in May 1992 dollars is \$22.1m. This estimate is subject to the normal processes of design and tender. It includes the residual value of the work (\$1m) already carried out.
- 5. The annual operational and maintenance cost of the dam is estimated in May 1992 dollars as \$85 000 per annum.

Difference between this amount and that in the EIS for the full dam (pp 74-75 of Vol 1, p 12-15 Appendix 5 Vol 2) are -

- (a) escalation;
- (b) silt and debris removal at sacred site (extent still subject to negotiation with traditional owners);
- (c) variation in sediment transfer;
- (d) clearing of debris; and
- (e) maintenance of pump and reticulation system.
- 6. As construction of the dam can no longer proceed, the question of opportunity cost is no longer applicable.
- 7. The Average Annual Preventable Damage (AAPD) has been assessed at \$540 000 (October 1990 dollars). The calculation of AAPD is a complex matter and the attention of the honourable member is drawn to the EIS for details.
