1. MEETING:

The Assembly met at 10.00 a.m., according to order of the Speaker, the Honourable R.W.S. Vale, pursuant to Sessional Order. Mr Speaker, the Honourable R.W.S. Vale, took the Chair.

- 3. MESSAGE FROM HER MAJESTY THE QUEEN ADDRESS-IN-REPLY PAPER TABLED: Mr Speaker informed the Assembly that he had received the following letter from Mr Kenneth Scott, C.M.G., Assistant Private Secretary to Her Majesty the Queen, which he laid on the Table -

Dear Mr Speaker

I am commanded by The Queen to ask you to convey to the Legislative Assembly of the Northern Territory an expression of Her Majesty's sincere thanks for their kind and loyal message of greetings, sent on the occasion of the Opening of the First Session of the Fifth Assembly.

4. PETITION:

Mr Leo, by leave, presented a petition not conforming with Standing Orders from 394 citizens of the Northern Territory praying that expenditure cuts will not affect the quality of education and educational services in Nhulunbuy.

Petition read.

 - The following notice was given: Mr Smith: To move -

- (1) That this Assembly censures the Chief Minister for -
 - (a) misleading this Assembly and the people of the Northern Territory on the extent of the budget cuts that the Government needed to make;
 - (b) failing to properly consider the impact of those cuts on the lives of ordinary Territorians;
 - (c) failing to establish proper priorities for achieving those cuts; and
 - (d) the incompetent and careless way he has handled the crises confronting the Northern Territory; and
- (2) That this Assembly calls on the Chief to resign.

6. CENSURE OF CHIEF MINISTER - MOTION NEGATIVED: The Leader of Government Business (Mr Hanrahan) having informed the Assembly that the Government, pursuant to Standing Order 95, accepted the notice of motion as a censure motion -The Leader of the Opposition (Mr Smith) thereupon moved -

- (1) That this Assembly censures the Chief Minister for -
 - (a) misleading this Assembly and the people of the Northern Territory on the extent of the budget cuts that the Government needed to make;
 - (b) failing to properly consider the impact of those cuts on the lives of ordinary Territorians;
 - (c) failing to establish proper priorities for achieving those cuts; and
 - (d) the incompetent and careless way he has handled the crises confronting the Northern Territory; and
- (2) That this Assembly calls on the Chief to resign.

Debate ensued.

Suspension of sitting: The sitting was suspended between 11.49 a.m. and 2.00 p.m.

9. PETITION TO THE ELECTORAL TRIBUNAL - PAPER TABLED: The Clerk laid on the Table a copy of the Petition to the Electoral Tribunal of the Northern Territory of Australia in the matter of the Election for the Seat of Barkly and in the matter of the *Electoral Act*.

- 10. DISCHARGE OF GOVERNMENT BUSINESS ORDER OF THE DAY: The Minister for Labour and Administrative Services (Mr McCarthy), by leave, moved - That Government Business, Order of the Day No.1 relating to the Public Employment (Modification of Terms and Conditions of Employment) Bill 1987 (Serial 48) be discharged from the Notice Paper. Question - put and passed.
- 11. PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT (MODIFICATION OF TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT) BILL 1987 (Serial 53): The Minister for Labour and Administrative Services (Mr McCarthy), by leave, presented a Bill for an Act relating to terms and conditions of employment of certain persons employed in the Northern Territory Public Service, or in the service of certain public authorities, institutions or bodies, to amend the *Public Service Act* and the *Teaching Service Act*, to amend the Public Service (Terms and Conditions of Employment) By-laws, and for related purposes. Bill read a first time.

Mr McCarthy moved - That the Bill be now read a second time.

On the motion of Mr Leo (Nhulunbuy) debate was adjourned.

- 12. SUSPENSION OF STANDING ORDERS TAKE TWO BILLS TOGETHER: The Treasurer and Minister for Local Government (Mr Coulter) moved - That so much of Standing Orders be suspended as would prevent two Bills namely: the Stamp Duty Amendment Bill (No.3) 1987 (Serial 52) and the Taxation (Administration) Amendment Bill (No.2) 1987 (Serial 51) -
 - (a) being presented and read a first time together and one motion being put in regard to, respectively, the second readings, the Committee's report stage, and the third readings of the Bills together; and
 - (b) the consideration of the Bills separately in Committee of the Whole.

Question - put and passed - there being an absolute majority of the whole number of Members present and no dissentient voice.

- 13. STAMP DUTY AMENDMENT BILL (No.3) 1987 (Serial 52): and TAXATION (ADMINISTRATION) AMENDMENT BILL (No.2) 1987 (Serial 51): The Treasurer and Minister for Local Government (Mr Coulter), by leave, and pursuant to resolution, presented a Bill for an Act to amend the Stamp Duty Act and the Taration (Administration) Act. Bills read a first time. Mr Coulter moved - That the Bills be now read a second time. On the motion of Mr Ede (Stuart) debate was adjourned.
- 14. ALTERATION OF ORDER OF BUSINESS:

Debate ensued. Question - put and negatived.
- 16. SUSPENSION OF STANDING ORDERS PASS BILL THROUGH ALL STAGES: The Minister for Labour and Administrative Services (Mr McCarthy) moved -That so much of Standing Orders be suspended as would prevent the Public Employment (Modification of Terms and Conditions of Employment) Bill 1987 (Serial 53) passing through all stages at this sitting. Question - put and passed - there being an absolute majority of the whole number of Members present and no dissentient voice.
- 17. PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT (MODIFICATION OF TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT) BILL 1987 (Serial 53): The order of the day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question - That the Bill be now read a second time -Debate resumed. Question - put and passed. Bill read a second time. Leave granted for a motion for the third reading of the Bill to be moved forthwith. On the motion of the Minister for Labour and Administrative Services (Mr McCarthy) the Bill was read a third time and passed to be a proposed law. 18. Taxation (Administration) Amendment Bill (No.2) 1987 (Serial 51)

Clauses 1 to 4, by leave, taken together and agreed to. Clause 5 read -Mr Coulter moved the following amendment -

Omit from paragraph (a) of the proposed definition of "accommodation house" in subclause (1)(a) "short term" and insert in its stead "accommodation for the periods of less than 14 days".

Debate ensued. Amendment agreed to. Clause, as amended, agreed to. Clause 6 agreed to. Clause 7 read -Mr Coulter moved the following amendment -

Omit from proposed section 80D(1) "an accommodation unit" and insert in its stead "an accommodation unit after 31 March 1988".

Amendment agreed to. Mr Coulter moved the following further amendment -

Omit from proposed section 80D(3)(b) "period of 7 days" and insert in its stead "period of 14 days".

Debate ensued. Amendment agreed to. Mr Coulter moved the following further amendment -

Omit from proposed section 80E(1) "each month" and insert in its stead "the month of April 1988 and each subsequent month".

Amendment agreed to. Mr Coulter moved the following further amendment -

Omit from proposed section 80E(1) paragraph (a).

Amendment agreed to. Clause, as amended, agreed to. Remainder of the Bill, by leave, taken as a whole and agreed to. Bill to be reported with amendments.

The Speaker, (Mr Vale) resumed the Chair and the Chairman (Mr Dondas) reported accordingly and the report was adopted. The Treasurer and Minister for Local Government (Mr Coulter) moved -That the Bills be now read a third time. Debate ensued. Question - put and passed. The Bills were read a third time and passed to be proposed laws. 20. ADJOURNMENT: The Leader of Government Business (Mr Hanrahan) moved - That the Assembly do now adjourn. Debate ensued.
