Business activities, business structures and industries

The table below is intended as baseline information enabling all stakeholders to monitor change at agreed intervals. The data was gathered during the period May-July 2010 and represents a 'snapshot' at that particular time.

With a town population estimated at 933 in 2006 (source: NT Treasury's *Estimated Resident Population*), Angurugu has a diverse range of business activities representing a broad spectrum of industries. These businesses cater to the population's basic needs, *ie.* food, groceries and other essential items. They also provide services centred on construction and repairs and maintenance. It should be noted that Angurugu's residents have access to additional products and services in the nearby mining town of Alyangula (18km), which caters to a high number of permanent and temporary workers and their families.

The 33 (see Note 2 below) business activities recorded for Angurugu are, in their majority (45%), conducted under one structure, ie. 'Local Government'. Of note is the fact that 21% of business activities operate under a company structure.

With a town population estimated at 1,941 in 2006 (source: NT Treasury's *Estimated Resident Population*), Galiwinku has a diverse range of business activities representing a broad spectrum of industries. These businesses cater to the population's basic needs, *ie.* food, groceries and other essential items. They also provide services centred on construction; automotive services; and repairs and maintenance.

The 49 (see Note 2 below) business activities recorded for Galiwinku are, in their majority (64%), conducted by two entities, ie. 'Local Government' and 'Association'. Of note is the very low number of business activities operating under a Company structure, despite a comparatively significant number of business activities. Government involvement in 'Construction' relates to the Strategic Indigenous Housing and Infrastructure Program (SIHIP).

With a town population estimated at 2,362 in 2006 (source: NT Treasury's *Estimated Resident Population*), Maningrida has a diverse range of business activities representing a broad spectrum of industries. These businesses cater to the population's basic needs, *ie.* food, groceries and other essential items. They also provide a comparatively large number of other services centred on construction; repairs and maintenance; automotive service; and shipping/freight. Maningrida is further able to cater to visitor/temporary resident needs through the provision of some commercial accommodation and tourism services and products.

The 60 (see Note 2 below) business activities recorded for Maningrida are, in their overwhelming majority (68%), conducted under three main structures:

- 'Aboriginal Corporation';
- 'Association'; and
- 'Local Government'.

The Maningrida Art Centre supports local artists in producing and selling artwork. The other notable category of business operators is 'Sole Trader', which is the preferred structure for musicians, artists and (trade) professionals (27%).

The number of business activities recorded in Maningrida is the second-highest of all 15 Northern Territory priority Remote Service Delivery towns, behind Yirrkala.

The table below is intended as baseline information enabling all stakeholders to monitor change at agreed intervals. The data was gathered during the period May-July 2010 and represents a 'snapshot' at that particular time.

With a town population estimated at 785 in 2006 (source: NT Treasury's *Estimated Resident Population*), Yirrkala has a large range of business activities catering to the population's basic and other needs. Yirrkala further caters to limited visitor/temporary resident needs through the provision of visitor accommodation. In addition to the significant level of products and services available in town, Yirrkala residents are also able to benefit from their proximity to the large mining town of Nhulunbuy (17km).

Of the 64 business activities recorded for Yirrkala, 33% are conducted under 'Aboriginal Corporation', with 'Sole Traders' and 'Local Government' following at 27% and 20% respectively.

Despite a comparatively smaller population, Yirrkala has the highest number of business activities of all 15 Northern Territory priority Remote Service Delivery towns, ahead of Maningrida and Nguiu. This may be a reflection of Yirrkala's being both a regional and cultural hub.
