Clause 45.7 of the UCA Excess Leave – Where an employee has available recreation leave in excess of 60 days or 90 days in the case of a compulsory transferee the CEO may on giving a minimum of two months notice direct the employee to take up to one quarter of the total available recreation leave. Our policy is to remind managers twice a year of the rec leave liability.

ANSWER

The Department of the Chief Minister has implemented the following programs/strategies:

- Continued rationalisation of standalone printers, faxes and photocopiers and greater use of multi-function devices with built in energy efficiency functionality.
- Employees are continually encouraged to adopt more energy efficient practices such as turning off lights in areas when not occupied, minimising use of after-hours air-conditioning and completely shutting down computers at the end of the working day.
- The Department was an active participant in Earth Hour 2010.

The Department also adopted other measures related to reducing emissions, including:

- A waste paper and co-mingled recycling program in NT House to recycle cardboard and newspaper waste, used drink bottles, cans and plastic containers food containers, fluorescent light tubes.
- Mobile phones and accessories and toner cartridges are already recycled.
- The whole of Government *Greening the Fleet* policy was introduced from 1 July 2009 with an aim of achieving a 20% reduction in emissions from the fleet over the next five years. The allocation of vehicles is in accordance with this policy. In addition, during 2009-10, the department replaced the five VIP Fleet 8 cylinder petrol vehicles with 6 cylinder petrol/gas vehicles. The VIP Fleet drivers are encouraged to use gas wherever possible. This results in further improvement to fuel efficiency and reductions in emissions.
- The department also co-ordinated the introduction of TelePresence, a national videoconferencing network, which will reduce interstate staff travel and greenhouse gas emissions. This initiative was introduced with the assistance of the Australian Government, with a particular focus on COAG senior officials meetings in the first instance.
- These initiatives are all ongoing.

- The installation of lighting zone controllers and sensor lighting in some areas.
- Expanding the recycling presence to the placing of bins on each level of NT House
- Circulate green branded tips and policies both physically throughout NT House and on the department's intranet
- Establish an Energy Management Committee to be comprised of business unit representatives for the purpose of raising awareness of energy usage and sustainability issues within the Department
