## WRITTEN QUESTION

Mr Maley to the Minister for Essential Services:

## **Coolalinga Central Onsite Water Treatment Plant**

1. Please advise under what direction from Power Water Corporation (PWC) was the Onsite Water Treatment Plant (OSWTP) established at Coolalinga Central commercial shopping centre and residential estate?

There was no direction given by Power and Water to the developer. It was a negotiated agreement.

2. Why was the OSWTP established and managed by the developer and not PWC?

Power and Water negotiated with the developer as there was no reticulated or accessible treatment system in the area.

3. Are you aware of any situation at Coolalinga Central OSWTP that would be considered a risk to the community?

When operated correctly there should be no additional risk to the community.

4. What is PWC considering as options to provide a solution to this problem?

It is unclear what problem is referred to, noting the wastewater treatment solution is a matter for its private owners.

5. When will PWC be in a position to provide a public service with the installation of a rising main to this community and at what cost?

The cost of the rising main would need to be met by the developer or private owner. The cost of which has not been determined by Power and Water.

6. Why was the developer required to pay a \$1.8 million bond to PWC?

As security for the provision of wastewater treatment services should Power and Water need to step-in and operate the plant.

- a) How are PWC proposing to spend the \$1.8 million bond?

  On maintenance and operational activities to the treatment plant.
- 7. Has this \$1.8 million bond been quarantined for the OSWTP?

Yes.

8. Is the Government concerned about the protracted legal complexities that may prolong PWCs ability to access the site?

No.
