2020-21 State of the Service

The 2020-21 State of the Service Annual Report tabled in Parliament last month showed that the NT Public Service has ballooned by 1,022 employees to 24,612 during 2020-21 despite the hiring freeze declared by the Chief Minister in 2018.

The overall FTE numbers increased by +776 in 2020-21. The NT Government's continued response to COVID-19 is the significant driver with the majority of increases occurring in the Health network (+676 FTE)
