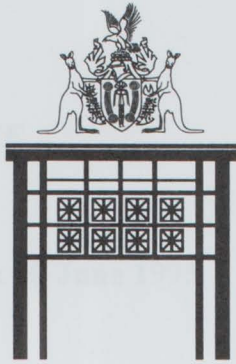

CHAIRMAN'S STATEMENT

As a result of the 1994 elections, the Committee was reconstituted, to continue its work in drafting a new Northern Territory constitution. To this end, the Committee has produced further discussion papers relating to issues such as a Bill of Rights for the Northern Territory and the constitutional recognition of local government.

Just as important as the issuing of discussion papers, the Committee has, during the course of the year, commenced the preparation and development of draft clauses in a new Northern Territory constitution. This work is reflected in the first Exposure Draft that was tabled in the Legislative Assembly on 22 June 1995.

The Exposure Draft is the culmination on many years work undertaken by members of this bi-partisan Committee through the research and preparation of papers, the holding of public hearings and a variety of other activities directed at promoting the cause of a new home-grown Northern Territory constitution. The essential parts to this first Exposure Draft relate to the Legislature, the Executive, the Judiciary, the sources of law in the Northern Territory and a preamble recognising the constitutional history of the Northern Territory and in particular, recognition of the major role Aboriginal people have played as an integral and valued part of the Northern Territory Community.

On 2 March 1995, the Committee tabled its Interim Report No. 1 - A Northern Territory Constitutional Convention, together with a series of recommendations. The primary elements of the report related to the mechanisms for the establishment and maintenance of a Territory Convention to adopt the new constitution and the make up and representation on that Convention.

Although the Committee did not conduct any public hearings during the year due to its work commitments in the preparation of the above documents, it will be conducting a series of hearings and workshops during the 1995/96 financial year with the intention of promoting (and reviewing where appropriate) the issues raised within the Exposure Draft and Interim Report No. 1.

Finally, I would like to express my appreciation for the co-operation of present and past members of this Committee for their excellent work and input in developing the documents that have been issued by this Committee. The issues raised in these documents have been critically examined by the Committee and although there may well be counter arguments to the views adopted, the Committee has been diligent in its endeavours and committed to developing a home-grown constitution that all Territorians would be proud to own. The process of constitution-making in the Northern Territory has not always had a smooth run, but the culmination of the process is now in sight. The Committee is acutely aware that without the involvement of the citizens of the Northern Territory in this process, the aim of achieving Statehood and constitutional equality with the States within the Australian Federation will not be achieved.

CHAIRMAN'S STATEMENT

As a result of the 1994 election, the Committee was re-elected to continue its work in drafting a new Northern Territory constitution. To this end, the Committee has produced further discussion papers relating to issues such as a Bill of Rights for the Northern Territory and the constitutional recognition of local government.

Just as important as the timing of discussion papers, the Committee has during the course of the year, commenced the preparation and development of draft clauses for a new Northern Territory constitution. This work is reflected in the first Report of the Committee which was tabled in the Legislative Assembly on 23 June 1995.

The Report of the Committee on many ways which would assist in the development of a new Northern Territory constitution through the research and provision of papers, the holding of public hearings and a variety of other activities directed at promoting the cause of a new Northern Territory constitution. The various papers to the first Report of the Committee were tabled in the Legislative Assembly, the Executive, the Judiciary, the various levels of the Northern Territory and a program recognizing the constitutional role of the Northern Territory and a program recognizing the role of Aboriginal people have also been tabled as an integral part of the Northern Territory Constitution.

On 2 March 1995, the Committee tabled its second Report No. 2 - A Northern Territory Constitutional Convention together with a series of recommendations. The primary objective of the report related to the mechanism for the establishment and maintenance of a Northern Territory Constitutional Convention and the role of the Convention and the role of the Convention in the development of a new Northern Territory Constitution.

Although the Committee did not conduct any public hearings during the year, the first report of the Committee in the preparation of the above document, it will be conducting a series of public hearings and workshops during the 1995-96 financial year with the intention of providing (and reviewing where appropriate) the issues raised within the Report of the Committee and its recommendations.

Finally, I would like to express my appreciation for the cooperation of public and non-members of the Committee for their excellent work and part in developing the documents that have been issued by the Committee. The issues raised in these documents have been actively examined by the Committee and although there may well be certain matters to be views adopted, the Committee has been diligent in its response and committed to developing a more progressive constitution for the Northern Territory. It is my hope that the process of constitutional reform in the Northern Territory has not always had a smooth and that the continuation of the process is now a right. The Committee is ready to work with the involvement of the citizens of the Northern Territory in the process, the aim of achieving a new and constitutional agreement with the State within the Australian Federation will be achieved.

1. INTRODUCTION

Establishment of Committee

On 28 August 1985, the Legislative Assembly by resolution, established the Select Committee on Constitutional Development. On 30 November 1989 the Legislative Assembly resolved to amend the Committee's Terms of Reference changing its status from a select committee to a sessional committee. The Sessional Committee was reconstituted on 27 June 1994, following the election in June 1994.

Terms of Reference

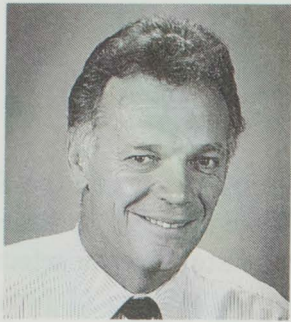
The Committee's primary terms of reference are:

1. to inquire into, report and make recommendations to the Legislative Assembly on:
 - (a) a Constitution for the new State and the principles upon which it should be drawn, including:
 - . legislative powers;
 - . executive powers;
 - . judicial power; and
 - . the method to be adopted to have a draft new state Constitution approved by or on behalf of the people of the Northern Territory;
 - (b) the issues, conditions and procedures pertinent to the entry of the Northern Territory into the Federation as a new State; and
 - (c) such other constitutional and legal matters as may be referred to it by:
 - . relevant ministers; or
 - . resolution of the Assembly;
2. to undertake a role in promoting the awareness of constitutional issues to the Northern Territory and Australian populations.

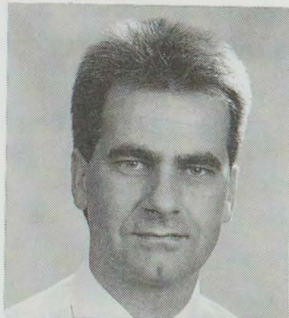

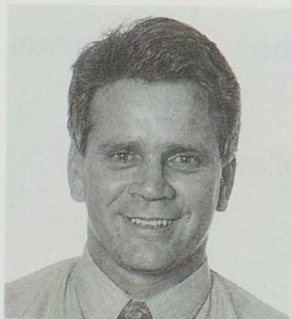

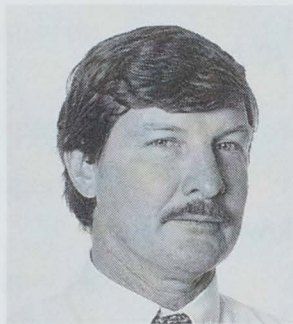

Functions of the Committee

The Committee derives its authority from the *Northern Territory (Self Government) Act 1978 (Cth)* and the *Legislative Assembly (Powers and Privileges) Act*. Under its terms of reference, the Committee has power to appoint sub-committees and to refer to any such sub-committee any matter that it is empowered to examine. Four members of the Committee constitute a quorum of the Committee whilst two members of a sub-committee constitute a quorum of that sub-committee.

The Committee or any sub-committee also has the power to:

- (a) send for persons, papers and records;
- (b) to adjourn from place to place;

-
- (c) to meet and transact business in public or private session;
 - (d) to sit during any adjournment of the Assembly;
 - (e) print from day to day such papers and evidence as may be ordered by it; and
 - (f) unless otherwise ordered by the Committee, a daily *Hansard* shall be published of such proceedings of the Committee as they take place in public.

Sub-Committee Membership

The Committee established sub-committees to take evidence and to promote discussion and awareness of constitutional issues throughout the Northern Territory.

Appendix 2 details the sub-committee membership as at 30 June 1995

Hearings and Meetings

Meetings of the Committee usually follow one of the following formats:

Public Hearings

Hearings are open to the public, including the media. The media may report any public session of the Committee, unless otherwise ordered by the Committee. Submissions to the Committee can be in written form or presented orally.

The Committee may also authorise the televising of the hearings under such rules as the Speaker of the Legislative Assembly may consider. Transcripts of the proceedings are produced by *Hansard*.

Deliberative Meetings

This format is used for private meetings of the Committee where "confidential" matters and the proceedings of the Committee may be discussed, together with general administrative business. Deliberative meetings are minuted but are not transcribed by *Hansard*.

Briefings

Briefings are not open to the public and are generally of a confidential nature and may go before, during or after a public hearing or be used in gathering general information by the Committee.

Taking of Evidence

Like all parliamentary committees, the Committee's effectiveness is largely reliant on the type and content of information developed, gathered or submitted during its deliberations. The source and content of information, in the written and oral submissions received by the

Committee, can be of a professional and specialist nature on specific subjects, or the promotion and presentation of particular attitudes and trends and ideas.

Public Awareness on Constitutional Issues and Statehood

A major aspect of the Committee's work under its Terms of Reference is the promotion of constitutional and Statehood issues.

The Committee has identified a desired procedure for the adoption of a Northern Territory constitution in its Information Paper No. 1: *Options for a Grant of Statehood* that comprises:

- (a) the preparation of a Report and a draft constitution by the Committee for presentation to the Legislative Assembly with options where necessary;
- (b) the draft constitution, following debate in the Legislative Assembly, to be put to a Territory Constitutional Convention established by the Legislative Assembly with broad representation from across the Northern Territory community;
- (c) the draft constitution to be submitted to a referendum of Northern Territory electors for approval; and
- (d) the constitution, as so approved, will then be implemented by or pursuant to a specific grant of powers by the Commonwealth Parliament.

In adopting the above procedure, the Committee has expressed the view, that the new State constitution be prepared by Territorians, with no imposition from outside agencies, be acceptable to the Federal Government and that the views of the States should be sought.

Since 1988, programs in promoting public awareness on these issues are still continuing.

Notable examples are:

- the public hearings and meetings held in major centres throughout the Northern Territory;
- the meetings held with Northern Territory Aboriginal communities during 1989 and 1990; and
- the "*Constitutional Change in the 1990s*" Conference in October 1992, organised by this Committee.

Other avenues that the Committee has utilised in promoting Northern Territory constitutional issues is through the continuing interaction with the Constitutional Centenary Foundation, the attendance to and participation in major conferences that impinge on the work of this Committee in developing a new Territory or State constitution.

2. COMMITTEE ACTIVITIES 1994/95

General Review

This year a number of activities were conducted by the Committee including the consolidation of evidence received, the preparation of further discussion papers, and the development of strategies in promoting constitutional issues for 1995 and beyond.

Individual members of the Committee continued to undertake promotional and speaking engagements throughout the Northern Territory.

Public Submissions

By the end of the year the Committee has received 120 written submissions.

Strategies for 1995 and Beyond

Committee members expressed a concern as to where the Committee was heading and whether the development of further discussion papers was an adequate response to its terms of reference.

A strategy paper outlining the following issues was presented to the Committee in December 1993:

- The completion of short term goals relating to the general activity of the Committee, such as updating evidence received, the preparation of discussion papers, reports, other promotional activities.
- The identification and formulation of long term strategies such as:
 - ◇ the form, content and format of a draft constitution;
 - ◇ reviewing the desired procedure for the adoption of a Northern Territory constitution and other issues relating to eventual Statehood including a possible timetable; and
 - ◇ the re-establishment of public awareness programs to Northern Territory urban centres, Aboriginal and remote communities.

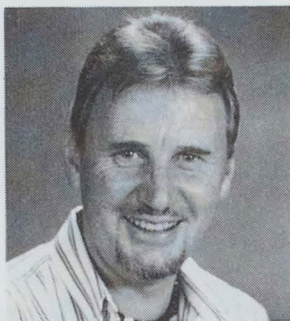
3. ADMINISTRATION AND STAFFING

SALARY AND ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES: 1994/95

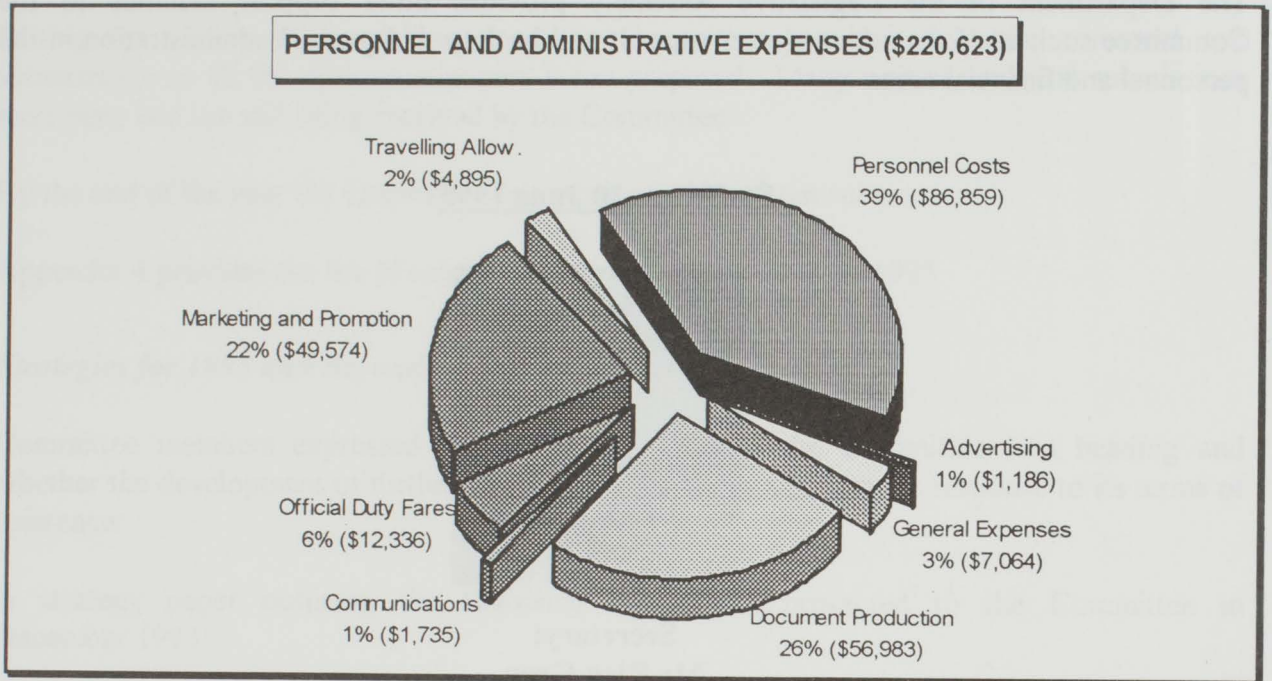


Figure 1: Committee Item Expenditure by Category of Cost
