Cut Crime in the NT by 10% a Year in First Term (EC0168)

- Ongoing.
- Northern Territory Police (NT) continues to focus on reducing crime, which is one of the three components of its strategic direction of 'Operational Excellence'.
- Figures for the 2013-14 financial year-to-date (preliminary data as at the end of May 2014) shows a significant reduction in the number of property offences.
- For the 2013-14 financial year to date (as at the end of May 2014), total victim based crime was 9.7% less than the same period in 2012-13.
- Total Offences Against Property for the current financial year to date are below the previous year level and exceeding the 10% reduction target (currently 12.0% as at end May 2014). The reduction of the previous year level is replicated across all three Police Commands, but most notably in Darwin Metropolitan Command (-12.5%) and Southern Command (-19%). At a Divisional level, Alice Springs and Tennant Creek show the largest reductions across the Territory, with 21.8% and 27.2% less Offences Against Property in these areas compared to the same time last year.
- Patterns in Offences Against the Person for the 2013-14 financial year to date have significantly changed over the past five months. For the past two months, the current year-to-date figures remain below the same period last year (-0.75%). Both Northern and Southern Command figures remain lower than the previous year to date. Darwin Metropolitan Command is currently 2.8% higher than last year, but has continued to trend downwards over recent months. At a divisional level, several areas are well below last year figures, most notably Katherine (down 11%), Central Desert (down 10.2%), Palmerston (down 5.2%) and Alice Springs (down 5.0%).
- NT Police continues to focus on reducing crime and intelligence-led operations to target recidivist offenders. In addition, NT Police is regularly utilising the legislative tools available to combat and deter crime, including the alcohol protection orders, which have now been in place for four months.

This information was extracted from the Northern Territory Government (NTG) Agency Purchase Requisition Online (APRO) system.</p> <p>NTPFES awards contracts based on the NTG Procurement Framework and value-for-money principles. NTPFES does not know or care about the political affiliations of successful tenderers.</p>				

In summary, 34 contracts were awarded over the reporting period at a total value of \$17.2M as highlighted below. This figure includes estimated purchasing volumes for period contracts normally for a three year period.

Northern Territory (NT) businesses were awarded 11 contracts at a total value of \$2.2M and interstate businesses were awarded 23 contracts at a total value of \$15.1M.

Four larger interstate period contracts totalling \$12.5M skew the above figures. These contracts were for specialist equipment or proprietary systems such as two leased planes (\$6.7M), mobile data in police vehicles (\$2.5M) although the satellite component was to a NT company, repairs and maintenance of the P25 digital communications network (\$2M) and the Joint Emergency Communication Centre dispatch systems maintenance (\$1.3M).

The types of contracts across the year includes Closed Circuit TV, Apple tablets, cleaning, tactical training, equipment such as forensics cameras and fume cabinets, various boats and motorbikes and the specialist items above.

Select Tenders may be sought following the issue of a CoE from Public Tendering by the Accountable Officer with approval of the Procurement Review Board and Agency Minister. In addition to the above Procurement Directions, NTPFES has standing exemptions from public tendering for 'Specialist Police, Fire and Emergency Services Equipment' as per Procurement Direction PR8. NTPFES advanced two Certificates of Exemption in 2013/14, with two Tier 4 Select Tenders progressed under the provisions of Procurement Directions PR8. Details are provided below.

1. Northern Territory Police Fire and Emergency Services Certificate of Exemption issued 2013/14

Description of goods and services: Contract: D13-0258- Darwin – Provision of Maintenance Support, Goods and Services, Project Management, and Installation Services of the Digital

Radio Network for a period of 36 months.

This tender involves the provision of digital network services. NTPFES has operated the P25 Digital Radio Network since 2010. This procurement seeks to establish a new contract for the continued delivery of tactical digital communications throughout the Northern Territory. The procurement includes:

- a. Maintenance and support to the P25 Digital Radio Network (the department's principal tactical communication means).
- b. Provision of goods and services, including specialist equipment and software to maintain functionality.
- c. Supply of goods and services from third parties for the networks operation, including peripheral items which will maintain the 'proprietary systems operation'.
- d. Delivery and management of specific technical projects in support of network operations.

Value of Goods and Services: \$2,033,421 for 36 months.

Why was a Certificate of Exemption Required? NTPFES recommended a Certificate of Exemption from Public Tendering be issued for the following reasons:

- A. The proprietary nature of the equipment only allows for the original equipment manufacturer to maintain, modify and update the network.
- B. There are multiple Intellectual Property elements within the network which Motorola has exclusivity over, meaning Motorola are the only eligible contractors capable of performing the works.

The recommendation was the current contractor, Motorola, be solely invited to re-tender for this requirement for a 36 Month period which will minimise business continuity risks to NTPFES.

This tender involved the provision of software maintenance and support for the various Intergraph products used by the NTPFES in the Joint Emergency Services Call Centre. Optional provision of additional software products planned to be purchased in the next 12 months. Optional provision of formal, rather than ad-hoc, Business Support arrangements.

Safran Morpho currently provides the IT solution for the Commonwealth in hosting the IT framework in support of the National Automated Fingerprint Identification System (NAFIS) database, and provides the administrative, technical and maintenance support services nationally across all jurisdictions relating to the LiveScan capability/software. This is proprietary software, of a sensitive nature that is tightly controlled. These systems fall under the category of 'Specialist Police Tactical Equipment', specifically for gathering and matching intelligence information.
