That the Territory Government detail its implementation plan for tackling the housing deficit in remote communities including:

- How shires, regional authorities and housing organisations will make decisions about what to build, where to build, how to build and who will build.
- How many new houses will be constructed, when they will be constructed and where they will be constructed next year and over the next 10 years.
- How many new bedrooms will be constructed, when will they be constructed and where they will be constructed next year and over the next 10 years.
- How many local remote employees will be eligible for Government Employee
  Housing, what Departments do they work for and in what communities they
  reside.
- How many new houses will be constructed for local Government Employees next year and over the next 10 years.
- How tenancy management will be devolved to local communities.
- 2. Mrs Finocchiaro (Deputy Leader of the Opposition) will move on the next General Business day that the Territory Government take seriously the importance of local businesses for the creation of jobs in the Northern Territory.
- 3. Ms Purick (Member for Goyder) will move as Assembly Business on the next meeting day:
  - That a select committee to review planning decisions by planning ministers comprising two members nominated by the Chief Minister, two members nominated by the Leader of the Opposition and two independent members be appointed. will move as Assembly Business
  - 2. The committee is to inquire into and report on the decisions of planning ministers between August 2012 and August 2016:

- a) Regarding major rezoning, exceptional development permits and special purpose applications; and
- b) Where extraordinary powers were exercised by the minister.
- 3. In examining these decisions, the committee is to have regard to:
  - a) What external stakeholders were consulted in the decision making;
  - b) What property owners and proponents associated with applications met with the planning minister prior to a decision being made;
  - c) What consultants were paid by the government in relation to any of the decisions;
  - d) The aggregated concerns of the community on key planning decisions including, but not limited to, Lowther Road, Gardens Hill, Dundee Beach Shop, Fred's Pass Road, Bayview expansion, and the sub regional Litchfield Plan being declared into the NT Planning Scheme prematurely.
- 4. The committee may proceed to the dispatch of business notwithstanding that all members have not been appointed and notwithstanding any vacancy.
- 5. The committee is to report within four months of the committee's first meeting.
- 6. The foregoing provisions of the resolution have effect notwithstanding anything contained in the standing orders.
- 4. Mr Wood (Member for Nelson) will move on the next General Business day that the Government in consultation with the NT Land Corporation develop a plan for the long term management of the Shoal Bay coastline between Tree Point Conservation Reserve and the Gunn Point Peninsula that would eventuate into a formal Conservation or Marine Park.

That the Government build a permanent park ranger station at Gunn Point to make sure the beaches and hinterland adjacent to those beaches are protected from environmental damage as well as inappropriate behaviour from some visitors.
