Can you provide the number of total takeaway alcohol licences since June 2012 by year and by location? For those additional licences issued which, as we know, came in from 11 June 2014, can you please provide the reason for the licences being issued? Answer:

The total number of new take-away licences issued between June 2012 and March 2016 is nine (9).

In 2015, five (5) of these licenses were issued with two (2) in the Darwin CBD, one (1) in Stuart Park (Liquor Merchant), one (1) in the Palmerston area and one (1) in Berry Springs.

In 2016, four (4) of these licences were issued, all within the Palmerston area.

The new licences were issued following assessment of the applications, having regard to Part III and to the objects of the Liquor Act, and to the Takeaway Guidelines.

In addition to these nine (9), the Milikapiti Club was issued a variation to its liquor licence to reinstate takeaway sales in 2015. This has not been recorded as a new take away licence as the licensee had previously had been able to sell takeaway liquor until the time of the intervention in 2007.
