QUESTION ON NOTICE 6.14

Are you satisfied with the quality of acquittals in relation to Territory expenditure to the Central Australian Aboriginal Congress? Do you intend to investigate the Territory exposure further in relation to issues surrounding Central Australian Aboriginal Congress? What is the quality of the acquittal process, with a full description in relation to the Territory Government's granting of monies to Central Australian Aboriginal Congress?

ANSWER

I am advised by the Department of Health that the acquittals by Central Australian Aboriginal Congress are as required pursuant to the specific service level agreements.

The Department of Health has conducted an initial review of acquittal compliance and found no areas of concern.

The Department of Health is in contact with the Commonwealth Government in relation to its audit outcomes and will take appropriate action should any issues of concern related to NTG funding and acquittal be identified.

I have also requested that the Department further review all of its service level agreements with Congress, performance reports and acquittals for the current and last financial year and provide me with a report.

The Department of Health's acquittal process requires funded agencies to provide 6 monthly performance and financial reports that address the funded outputs and annual Audited Financial Statements. Should these reporting requirements identify any issues with the level of performance or financial acquittal, the service agreements allow for withholding of payments until the Department is satisfied that the reports and performance are adequate as well as the ability to seek funding be repaid.

QUESTION ON NOTICE 6.15

How many calls has the NT-wide, 24-hour Mental Health Triage and Response Service taken in 2011-12?

ANSWER

The number of contacts by NTCATT from 1 July 2011 to 31 May 2012 was 4719 contacts for 2492 people. This figure includes both telephone calls and face to face contact.

QUESTION ON NOTICE 6.16

How much is it costing to house, treat and care for the male client who resides parttime if not full-time at a McMinns Lagoon property, which involves two correctional officers, rental of the property, insurance on the property and the cost of carers for the male client?

ANSWER

The rent on the property at McMinns Lagoon is approximately \$35,000 per annum.

Two support workers were provided to support the client at the property for three to four hours, twice a week. The cost per week for the carers is approximately \$4370.

The insurance is covered by the landlord because the Department of Health is a tenant. There is no insurance on contents because the Northern Territory Government self insures.

The question on the cost of the correctional officers will need to be referred to the Department of Justice.

Question:

Are there any special conditions attached to the mining management plan and authorisation and what are they, including hours of operation, noise monitoring, dust monitoring and any

community consultation?

Answer:

Further to the answer given by Mr Alister Trier, Executive Director Minerals and Energy, the conditions on the Authorisation are as follows:

- (a) Mining is not to extend below 15 metres from the natural land surface, unless an amended Mining Management Plan (MMP) has been submitted and written approval has been given by the Department of Resources (DoR).
- (b) Material extracted is not to exceed 400 000 tonnes, unless an amended MMP has been submitted and written approval has been given by DoR.
- (c) Any groundwater intercepted by the mining activities is to be retained on site in suitable water detention ponds or tanks unless an amended MMP has been submitted and written approval has been given by DoR.
- (d) Any groundwater intercepted is to be tested at intervals of not more than one month, for contaminants and turbidity and the results are to be reported to DoR on a monthly basis.
- (e) During the period from the date of the Authorisation to 21 June 2012 (and at any other time during the term of this Authorisation as directed by the Director Mining Environmental Compliance), an independent study of noise levels is to be conducted at the cost of D.A.C. Enterprises Pty Ltd, specifically to identify the impact of the mining activities on the noise levels occurring along the distant side of Wallaby-Holtze Road, and to determine (i) background noise levels, (ii) maximum noise levels generated by mining activities, and (iii) the most appropriate methods to reduce the impact on the local environment of noise generated by mining activities. An independent consultant's report is to be provided to the Director Mining Environmental Compliance on or before 1500 hours Friday 22 June 2012, and where recommendations are made by the independent consultant about any procedures or methods to reduce the impact on the local environment of any noise generated by mining activities, such report must be incorporated into an amended MMP and a system, including

- procedures, consistent with those recommendations must be implemented to reduce the impact of noise on the local environment.
- (f) Consent of the Power Water Corporation (PWC) is to be obtained as soon as practicable after the date of the Authorisation, to carry out any activities on the mining site in proximity to power services, owned or operated by PWC located within the mining site or along any access route. The consent of PWC must specifically include consent for the passing of vehicles in proximity to power services.

What are the requirements in regard to an extractive operation under the Mining Management Act having signs indicating that it

is a mining project?

Answer:

The *Mining Management Act* does not contain specific requirements regarding use of signage at mine sites. However, following a recent site inspection, the Department of Resources (DoR) will be sending a letter to the operator advising them that Taylor Road is a public road and that they should take steps to delineate their operation from a public access road.

DoR will also suggest that erecting signage informing the public of an operating mine would be advisable under the circumstances.
