- three dwellings located at 174 Forrest Parade, Rosebery (from Solidcon No.2 Trust Pty Ltd); and
- one dwelling located at 30 Parap Road, Parap (from Margetic and Sitzler Consolidated Holdings Pty Ltd).
- 2. Where are the eight new public housing dwellings built under the Urban Housing Strategy suburbs/towns is sufficient, do not need addresses (p5)?

The eight new public housing dwellings built under the Urban Housing Strategy are located as follows:

- six dwellings built in Zuccoli;
- one dwelling built in Wagaman; and
- one dwelling built in Tiwi.
- 3. What are the details of the \$30.8 million spent on town camps? That is, there were "271 projects commenced and 207 completed". What were those projects and in which camps? Who were the contractors involved? (p6)

Funding has been provided mainly to the Aboriginal controlled housing sector, via a grants program, who have in turn focused on contracting local Aboriginal businesses.
