In 2014, Operation Flinders only operated in South Australia, expanding to the Northern Territory in 2015 with Loves Creek Station.

3. How many have re-offended since participating in the boot camps?

**Answer:**

Early Intervention Youth Boot Camps is a program primarily focused on preventing young people entering the youth justice system. Reoffending is not included among the number of performance indicators the program is monitored and evaluated against, as most EIYBC participants have not been before the court.
