The NTPFES advanced the following review during the reporting period:

Airwing Review (internal)

The Terms of Reference was to identify the most efficient and effective model for the Police Airwing and report back to 2023 Budget Cabinet.

Expertise and advice was sought from a Northern Territory Aviation Industry expert, and across the NTG particularly Department of Health for aviation discussions and the Department of Corporate and Digital Development for the procurement Request-For-Information (RFI) process.

Internally, the NTPFES Chief Pilot was extensively engaged core frontline business executive for operational policing expertise, the Risk Management and Governance and Business Improvement branches and multiple previous Airwing and broader policing reviews. The review was progressed from existing resources and no additional cost was incurred.

The report will not be tabled in the Legislative Assembly.

The total expenditure across all workers compensation claims for the period 1 July 2022 to 31 March 2023 was \$14,636,233.

\$2,657,554 of the total expenditure related to the 92 workers compensation claims lodged in the reporting period. The remaining \$11,978,679 related to expenditure for workers claims lodged prior to 1 July 2022.

A total of 115 new Workplace Injury Early Intervention (WIEI) claims were lodged in the reporting period. Total WIEI expenditure for the reporting period was \$83,563.

45. Please detail the number of stress related matters and claims for the period 1 July 2022 to 31 March 2023.

Answer:

27 workers' compensation claims relating to 'mental stress' were lodged between 1 July 2022 to 31 March 2023. Liability of five of the workers' compensation claims were disputed by the NTG workers' compensation claims manager, Gallagher Bassett.

Of the 27 workers' compensation claims lodged for mental stress, 20 included a diagnosis of post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD).

Expenditure for the 27 workers' compensation claims for mental stress in the reporting period total \$1,547,573.

Police Northern Command includes 254 general duties, investigative and police auxiliary liquor inspectors' roles across Katherine, Nhulunbuy and other regional and remote stations including Wadeye, Maningrida, Groote Eylandt and Borroloola amongst others. Supported by 15 public sector roles. Total expenditure of \$46.7M.

Police Southern Command includes 413 general duties, investigative and police auxiliary liquor inspectors roles across Alice Springs, Tennant Creek and other regional and remote stations including Yuendumu, Yulara and Kintore amongst others. Supported by 45 public sector roles the majority Aboriginal Liaison Officers. Total expenditure of \$61M.

Fire Northern Command includes eight fire fighter roles across Katherine, Nhulunbuy and Jabiru stations. Supported by one public sector role. Total expenditure of \$2.9M.
