Due to the administrative effort required to provide a detailed itemised breakdown of advertising and communications costs, the Department of People, Sport and Culture has provided a broad overview of its communications and marketing activities for the period.

The Department of People, Sport and Culture's total expenditure on marketing, advertising and communications for the period 1 July 2025 to 31 March 2026 was \$536,475.

This expenditure includes costs associated with:

- printing collateral such as posters, flyers and banners;
- event delivery costs including venue hire signage and merchandise;
- advertising across print, online and social media channels;
- graphic design and digital content development including promotional materials and infographics to support community awareness and stakeholder engagement; and
- administrative costs including subscriptions to digital publishing and marketing software.

As a diverse community-focused agency, the Department of People, Sport and Culture has broad marketing and communications requirements. These activities generally relate to:

- promoting grants and funding opportunities to sectors and the community;
- promoting opportunities for communities to provide feedback and participate in 'Have Your Say' consultations;
- delivering annual arts, sport and community recognition events;
- workforce recruitment advertising;
- promoting programs, events, services, vouchers and concessions; and
- communicating community rights, responsibilities and available supports.

Where possible, marketing and communications services such as strategy, content development and social media management are delivered internally. Some specialist services, including graphic design and photography, are outsourced following Machinery of Government changes in late 2024. All advertising placements are booked through the Northern Territory Government's approved provider, Atomic 212.

Primary advertising channels include the NT News, community radio and digital advertising through NTG owned social media channels.

Key marketing and communications expenses included:

- \$114,040 for State Square Building EOI promotion;
- \$116,718 for sponsorship activities;
- \$111,618 for general marketing and communications; and
- \$194,099 for major events.

Notable marketing and communications activities for the period 1 July 2025 to 31 March 2026 included:

- national and international promotion of the State Square Building EOIs
- sponsorship of the Operation Thrive program and NT Young Achiever Awards (2 award categories)
- delivery of the Northern Territory Performing Arts Awards

As at 31 March 2026, the Department of People, Sport and Culture contributed over \$26 million to reduce cost of living pressures through the delivery of Sport Vouchers, Learn to Swim Vouchers, grant programs to keep kids engaged in sports and recreational activities, and the Northern Territory Concession and Seniors Recognition Schemes. This is an important part of restoring the Territory's lifestyle.

Contributing to sport and activities by providing two \$100 Sport Vouchers or Learn to Swim Vouchers each year helps reduce the cost for families to keep their kids active and involved.

NT residents aged 65 or over can access a \$550 prepaid card every year to spend as they choose. In addition, NT residents aged 60 or over can access hundreds of discounts across the Territory with an NT Seniors Discount Card, managed by COTA NT.

The Northern Territory Concession Scheme provides concessions on a range of essential goods and services to help with living expenses, including: \$200 per annum for council rates and \$150 per year on garbage services, up to \$1,200 per annum on electricity, \$800 per annum on water and sewerage, free renewal on NT driver's licence, up to \$154 per annum on vehicle registration, and up to \$502.20 every 2 years for spectacles.
