2. Regarding the announcement of 18,000 "pieces of equipment, furniture and fittings" installed into Palmerston Regional Hospital (media release 6/6). Was this all locally sourced? Which local companies benefited from the supply of the equipment, furniture and fittings? How much was spent on the 18,000 pieces

Current tracking of expenditure for Furniture, Fixtures and Equipment installed into Palmerston Regional Hospital is \$17.25 million.

Equipment, furniture and fittings have been sourced from a variety of suppliers both locally and outside of the Northern Territory. The expenditure includes major medical equipment or other equipment that is not available in the Northern Territory.

3. What medical staff have been recruited for the PRH and how many?

Over 93% of the medical workforce has been recruited. PRH has a total 62.25 FTE medical workforce (67 positions). As per the integrated service delivery model and one hospital/two campus model, Royal Darwin Hospital medical workforce will be rotating across both hospital sites.

4. What is the expected budgeted staff costs for PRH in its first stage of operation?

The staff and operational expenses have been costed within the initial year's operational budget of approximately \$57 million.

5. What changes have you made to the PRH design and why? How much did those changes cost?

The design was approved in 2015 and the facility was constructed as approved.

Improvements on the design include covered carparks, additional courtyard shade, landscaping improvements, inclusion of client procured medical imaging, ICT amendments and Central Sterile Services Department improvements to enhance the end users comfort levels and improved levels of care.

The \$230,000 improvements were possible due to savings between the estimates and final contract packages.

6. What services precisely will be relocated from RDH to PRH?

Rehabilitation services and Geriatric Evaluation and Management (GEM) services will be transferred from RDH to PRH.

7. What will staffing levels be at when it opens?

Approximately 350 FTE will be on site for the opening day of PRH operations, which will increase incrementally as staged services commence.

8. Will there be a public open day for the PRH?

A community day has been organised for 11 August 2018 to enable the community to view the hospital before it opens and see the space and services available.

9. Are there any plans to construct additional buildings/extensions or provide additional services to PRH?

A \$2.65 million hydrotherapy pool will be constructed in 2018/19.

10. Confirm the final number of:

- a. Disabled car parks
- b. General car parks
- c. Number of car parks under roof/shade structure
- a. Disabled car parks 19
- b. General car parks 292
- c. Number of car parks under roof/shade structure 246

11. When will the public bus service commence servicing PRH and what route will it take?

A new bus route has been developed which will commence on opening of the hospital from the Palmerston Bus interchange to PRH.

This service will provide connections to the broader Darwin Bus Network, offering 30 minutes frequency and 15 minutes during peak times, and operating until 11pm six days a week and until 9pm on Sundays and public holidays.

12 Will there be a taxi rank at PRH?

There will be a taxi rank at the front of the hospital to support ease of access for patients and visitors. The taxi rank arrangements will be the same as those that currently exist at RDH.

13 Will the Palmerston RDH Shuttle Bus be extended to take patients to PRH?

The Top End Patient Travel Service bus will transport non-admitted patients requiring ambulatory care appointments between the two sites.
