Question 1(a)

The table below provides the total number of offences and total number of arrests against defined categories, including the number of those that were alcohol-related, for both Mitchell Street and the suburb of Darwin City for the 2011-12 and 2012-13 financial years.¹

A review of City Safe in 2012 inclusive of a dedicated roster including resources from MPG, has meant increased proactive policing and an increased detection of offending across all categories reported on, particularly offences against the person and public order offences.

There is a 92% increase in arrests for offences against the person. This is due to targeted frontline policing taking a zero tolerance approach and detecting and apprehending offenders responsible for alcohol-fuelled violence in and around licensed premises on Mitchell Street.

There is a 53% increase from 2011-12 to 2012-13 for offences against the person clearance rates by arrest. This is due to targeting identified offenders and apprehending those responsible for both domestic and alcohol-fuelled violence in Darwin City.
