Dear Scrutiny Committee,

Thank you for the opportunity to contribute to this decision-making process. My name is Lucinda, I am a Jingili resident who works in the NT health system and have started my family in Darwin. I love our community and our NT environment. I am inspired by the possibility of contributing to informed decision making, which is why I am writing today.

I have put together the following recommendations for your review during the drafting process of the Territory Coordinator (TC) Bill:

1. Transparency and Accountability:

- If the TC bill is passed, then all Step-in Notices (Section 56) and Exemption Notices (Section 64) should be **publicly posted in real time** and include clear, detailed justifications. This ensures transparency and public accountability.
- Require **affirmative parliamentary resolution and public consultation** for any regulation proposing to add to the Schedule.

2. Regulation-Making Powers:

• Remove the ability to add Scheduled laws via regulation (Section 3) to avoid unchecked expansion of TC powers.

3. Environmental Protections:

- Explicitly prohibit Exemption Notices from bypassing essential NT environmental and cultural laws. Please add back in and expand Section 64(3) to include a comprehensive list of protected safeguards.
- Explicitly protect core environmental and cultural laws (e.g., Environment Protection Act 2019, Territory Parks and Wildlife Conservation Act 1976) from exemption, regardless of regulatory changes.

4. Merits Review:

 Introduce an independent merits review process for significant statutory decisions made by the TC, addressing the limitation in Section 62 that currently allows only judicial review.

5. Balanced Decision-Making:

• Amend Section 8(1) to ensure equal weighting of social, environmental,

and economic outcomes in decision-making, providing a more balanced and sustainable framework.

6. Don't pass the TC bill at all:

• I am deeply concerned by the possibility of rapid change to laws that exist for a reason, with permanent consequences for the environment.

Thank you for considering these recommendations. I look forward to the outcome of this valuable consultation process.
