

Between 24 August 2024 and 9 December 2024, a total of 222 incidents were reported, with seven meeting the criteria for Notifiable Incidents under NT WorkSafe regulations.

Of these seven Notifiable Incidents, three have been closed following NT WorkSafe's determination that the Agency's response was appropriate and satisfactory.

Additionally, four of the seven Notifiable Incidents resulted in workers compensation claims.

Workforce Management initiated contact with 204 members who were reported to have sustained workplace injuries in the reporting period. Reports of injuries may have been received through the submission of AIIHR forms, executive notifications or reports from the member's OIC. The purpose of contact is to ensure appropriate reporting of injuries has occurred (where an AIIHR form may not have already been submitted), engagement of support services, if required, and discussion of injury management options, if medical treatment or costs had been or were likely to be incurred.

Of the 204 members contacted, 42 progressed applications under the NTPF Workplace Injury Early Intervention Program (WIEIP) and 19 lodged claims for workers compensation, three of which progressed from WIEIP.

Of the 42 WIEIP applications submitted, five were the result of assaults against police. Four were for biohazard exposures and one due to being hit by moving object.

Of the 19 workers compensation claims lodged, two were the result of assault against police and related to lacerations and bruising due to being kicked and punch in the head and face.

Police Northern Command includes 206 general duties, investigative and police auxiliary liquor inspectors roles across Katherine, Nhulunbuy and other regional and remote stations including Wadeye, Maningrida, Groote Eylandt and Borroloola amongst others. Supported by 32 public sector roles. Total expenditure of \$17.1M.

Some previous Northern Command Police Stations are now managed by Greater Darwin Command and have been removed from this response compared to previous years. This includes Wurrumiyanga, Pirlangimpi, Milikapiti, Adelaide River and Batchelor Police Stations.

Police Southern Command includes 281 general duties, investigative and police auxiliary liquor inspectors roles across Alice Springs, Tennant Creek and other regional and remote stations including Yuendumu, Yulara and Kintore amongst others. Supported by 47 public sector roles, with the majority being Aboriginal Liaison Officers. Total expenditure of \$21.7M.
