Question: In 2006, the government introduced its anti-gang laws under the Justice Legislation Amendment (Group Criminal Activities) Act 2006. How many offenders have been sentenced for creating a violent disorder under that Act - the penalty for which is one year - in 2009-10, and how does it compare with the preceding year?

Response:

In 2008-09, a total of 38 defendants were proven guilty of an offence under section 47AA of the Act. 17 received an actual imprisonment (include partially suspended) order, five received a fully suspended imprisonment order, one

received a home detention order, nine received a monetary order and the remaining six received another form of penalty such as a good behaviour bond.

Between 1 July 2009 and 31 March 2010, a total of 19 defendants were proven guilty of an offence under this Section of the Act. Four persons received an actual imprisonment (include partially suspended) order, one received a fully suspended imprisonment order, two received a home detention order, eight received a monetary order and the remaining four received another form of penalty such as good behaviour bond.
